AN ACT to create section 2464n of the statutes, creating board of county judges.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: Section 2464n. The several county judges of the state shall constitute a board to be known as the "board of county judges." They shall hold their first meeting at the courthouse, in the city of Milwaukee, on the last Thursday of June, 1917, and subsequent meetings once in each year thereafter, at such time and place as they may determine. They shall make such rules and regulations in accordance with law, and not inconsistent with the rules of practice adopted by the supreme court, as they shall deem advisable to promote the administration of the judicial business of the county courts of the state, and transact such other business as may properly come before them. Said board shall elect such officers as they may deem advisable for the proper conduct of their business, and such officers shall be elected for such terms as the board of county judges may determine. Such board may prescribe rules or by-laws for the conduct of their business. Each county judge attending the meeting or meetings of the board shall on presenting his certificate of attendance to the county treasurer of his county be reimbursed for his travel and hotel bills out of the general fund in the county treasury, provided that the county board of his county shall have theretofore, by resolution duly adopted for such purpose, authorized the attendance of said judge at the expense of said county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
