

across the highway right-of-way of size, depth and slope to conform to the said ditch on either side of said right-of-way and shall pay for or construct and shall maintain the necessary bridge or bridges across said ditch on such highway and shall not be liable to pay any other part of the cost of construction of such ditch.

2. The remainder of such total cost of construction shall be by order assessed and apportioned against the benefited lands, corporations and counties in proportion to the benefits assessed and such order of assessment shall be filed and recorded by the town clerk in his office. Said assessments shall be made within ten days after the contract is let if not theretofore made, but failure to make such assessments within that time shall not deprive the supervisors of power to make such assessments.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 513

AN ACT to amend subsection 9 of section 2394—52 of the statutes, relating to aid in procuring employment.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 9 of section 2394—52 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 2394—52. (9) To establish and conduct free employment agencies, to license and supervise the work of private employment offices, to do all in its power to bring together employers seeking employes and working people seeking employment, to make known the opportunities for self-employment in this state, to aid in procuring employment for the blind adults of the state, to aid in inducing minors to undertake promising skilled employments, to provide industrial or agricultural training for vagrants and other persons unsuited for ordinary employments, and to encourage wage earners to insure themselves against distress from unemployment. It shall investigate the extent and causes of unemployment in the state of Wisconsin and the remedies therefor in this and other countries, and it shall devise and adopt the most efficient means within its power to avoid unemployment, to provide employment, and to prevent distress from involuntary idleness.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
