The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (2) of section 20.08 and paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 20.55 of the statutes are repealed.

SECTION 2. The introductory paragraph of subsection (1) of section 20.08 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.08) (1) Annually, beginning July 1, * * *1919*, * * *thirtyeight* thousand dollars, as a general appropriation for the execution of his functions. Of this there is allotted:

AN ACT to amend subsection (2) of section 20.16 of the statutes, relating to the academy of sciences, and making appropriations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (2) of section 20.16 of the statutes, is amended to read: (20.16) (2) To the Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters: • • •

(a) • • • Annually, beginning July 1, 1915, one thousand five hundred dollars, for printing and • • • otherwise to carry on the work of said society; but no part of this appropriation shall be paid out of the state treasury until necessary to pay actual claims duly audited by the secretary of state.
