CHAPTER 368.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 482 of the laws of 1911 and chapter 435 of the laws of 1913, and to create section 959—58a of the statutes, relating to licensing by cities and villages of persons and corporations engaged in the business of installing or altering electrical work or wiring in buildings, or constructing, altering, remodeling or repairing any building or part of building or structure in such cities and villages.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 482 of the laws of 1911 and chapter 435 of the laws of 1913 are repealed.

SECTION 2. A new section is added to the statutes to read: Section 959—58a. The common council of any city or the village board of any village, however incorporated, is hereby authorized and empowered by ordinance to license and regulate any person, firm or corporation employed or regularly engaged as a contractor or subcontractor, for profit or gain, in the installing, erecting, constructing or altering of any electrical work or wiring in any building or part of building, or in the erecting, constructing, altering, remodeling or repairing of any building, part of building or structure, in any such city or village, and to fix a fee for such license at a sum not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars per annum.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 369.

AN ACT to create section 4575lb relating to the display of flags and providing a penalty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: Section 4575lb. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to display or exhibit at any meeting, gathering, or parade, public or private, the red flag or any other flag, banner or emblem, symbolizing or intended by the person or persons displaying or exhibiting the same, to symbolize a purpose to overthrow, by force or violence, or by physical injury to personal property, the government of the United States, or of the state of Wisconsin, or all government.
