In appreciation of the dignified and womanly demeanor of Mrs. Davidson during the years she was the official mistress of the executive home and her comely and beautiful life and character as daughter, wife, mother and friend, be it

Resolved, That when the two houses of the legislature adjourn today it do so out of respect to her memory and in sincere regard for Governor Davidson and his family.

Further Resolved, That engrossed copies of these resolutions be attested by the presiding officers and chief clerks of the senate and assembly and transmitted to the bereft family of deceased.

[Jt. Res. No. 108, S.] JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 75.

Referring to the next legislature a proposed amendment to the constitution.

WHERAS. A majority of the members elected to each of the two houses of the legislature have by joint resolution No. 97, A., agreed to the following proposed amendment to section 9 of article V of the constitution, relating to the compensation of the Lieutenant Governor. (Article V) Section 9. The lieutenant governor shall receive during his continuance in office * * * to be prescribed by law as an annual compensation to amount and time and manner of payment, which shall be in full for all traveling or other expenses incident to his duties. The compensation prescribed for lieutenant governor immediately prior to the adoption of this amendment shall continue in force until changed by the legislature in a manner consistent with the other provisions of this constitution.

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That this proposed amendment to the constitution be referred to the legislature to be chosen at the next general election, and that the same be published for three months previous to the time of hold-

ing such election.
