CHAPTER 258.

AN ACT to amend section 925—107 of the statutes, relating to the commissioner of public health.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 925—107 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 925-107. In every city governed by this chapter the mayor shall, once in two years, unless otherwise provided by local ordinance, nominate a regularly licensed physician as commissioner of public health; such commissioner shall hold his office for two years and until his successor shall be qualified. The commissioner of public health or health officer in all cities however incorporated having a population of twenty-five thousand or more as determined by the latest federal census, shall not engage in the private practice of medicine or in any other occupation which will conflict with the performance of his official The full-time health commissioner, in cities containing a population of twenty-five thousand or more, shall receive an annual salary to be fixed by the common council or the board of health, if provided for by local ordinance, and shall receive his expenses actually and necessarily incurred in the performance of his official duties.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
