CHAPTER 203.

AN ACT to repeal subsections (1) to (7) of section 29.19, to renumber subsection (8) of section 29.19 to be section 29.191, to amend said section 29.191 and to create a new section to be numbered section 29.19 of the statutes, relating to hook and line fishing.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsections (1) to (7) of section 29.19 of the statutes are repealed.

SECTION 2. Subsection (8) of section 29.19 of the statutes is renumbered to be section 29.191 of the statutes.

Section 29.191 of the statutes is amended to read: 29.191 There shall be no close season for hook and line fishing, except for large and small-mouthed bass, sturgeon and trout, in any of the following described waters: In the waters of the Mississippi river, Lower Lake St. Croix and up the St. Croix river to the Dells, the bays and bayous connected therewith and in the waters of La Fayette, Iowa and Green counties; in the waters of Lake Winnebago in Fond du Lac, Calumet and Winnebago counties, in Buffalo lake, Marquette county; in Puckaway lake in Marquette and Green Lake counties; in Lake Poygan in Winnebago and Waushara counties; in Lakes Winneconne, Big and Little Butte des Morts in Winnebago county; in the Fox river in Marquette, Columbia, Green Lake, Waushara and Winnebago counties; * * in the Wolf river in Winnebago county and in Waupaca county as far as the city limits of New London; in the Rock and Crawfish rivers and in Lake Ripley and Lake Koshkonong in Rock, Jefferson and Dodge counties. During the period from March first to May twenty-eighth, both dates inclusive. live or dead minnows shall not be used for bait in any of the above waters specified in Jefferson county. The open season for game fish in Lake Wisconsin in Columbia and Sauk counties shall be June first to December first, except large and small-mouthed bass, which shall be under the provisions of the general law. Kenosha county the open season for the variety of fish described in subsection (1), (6) and (7) of section 29.19 shall commence on May twenty-ninth.

SECTION 4. A new section is added to the statutes to be numbered and to read: 29.19 Except as expressly provided in this chapter and particularly in section 29.191, a close season is established for each variety of fish listed in the following table, extending during all the time in each year except the period embraced within the dates, both inclusive, set opposite the name of each variety or each locality, respectively, in the column headed "Open Season"; and except as expressly provided in this chapter, and particularly in section 29.191, no person shall take, capture, or kill fish of any such variety with hook and line at any time other than the open season therefor; nor in the open season in excess of the quantity, or under the minimum length for each fish, designated opposite each variety or each locality, respectively, in the column headed "Bag Limit". Such measurement of length shall be taken in a straight line from the tip of the nose to the utmost end of the tail fin.

CHAPTER 204.

AN ACT to repeal section 61.35 and to create a new section to be numbered section 61.35 of the statutes, relating to village planning.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 61.35 of the statutes is repealed.

Section 2. A new section is added to the statutes to be numbered and to read: 61.35 The provisions of section 62.23 shall apply to any village which shall by ordinance so provide, and the powers and duties conferred and imposed by said section upon mayors, councils and specified city officials are hereby conferred upon presidents, village boards, and village officials performing duties similar to the duties of such specified city officials, respectively. Any ordinance or resolution heretofore passed by any village board under the provisions of section 61.35 shall be and remain in full force and effect until repealed or amended by such village board.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
