## CHAPTER 246.

AN ACT to create section 24.341 of the statutes, relating to refunds and payments out of the state treasury in the case of void sales of public lands.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 24.341 Whenever any claim shall be made under section 24.34, the commissioners of public lands shall make an investigation and determination, and offset the value of the use of said land, property removed therefrom and the damage or injury thereto by such claimant, together with interest thereon, against the amounts actually paid to the state and to any other persons on account of the purchase, possession, use, damage or injury to such lands by said claimants. The refund or payment to be made under section 24.34 shall in no case be more than the excess, if any, of the amounts paid out by such claimant with interest over such offset.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 247.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 29.28 and to create section 29.191 of the statutes, relating to fishing.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 29.28 of the statutes is amended to read: (29.28) (1) No person shall take, catch, or kill fish of any variety through the ice on Pardeeville mill pond in the town of Wyocena, Columbia county; in Lilly lake in Kenosha county; Pine lake, town of Hancock, and Fish lake, towns of Hancock and Deerfield; Pleasant lake in the town of Coloma, Waushara county, and in the town of Springfield, Marquette county; Lake Nocquebay in Marinette county; Lake Mason,
