and approved by the governor and secretary of state, which shall be filed with his official bond. Subject to the general direction of the commissioner of insurance as to the amount to be invested, and the kind and maturity of the securities, and to the approval of the secretary of state, attorney-general, state treasurer and commissioner of insurance acting as a board, the state treasurer shall cause the moneys in the life fund to be invested and reinvested in the securities authorized in section 206.34, and in like manner may sell and dispose of such securities as may be necessary in the management of such fund. In making such investments, preference shall be given to applications for loans to farmers and co-operative associations.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 402.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 46.05 and section 47.05 of the statutes, relating to placing the institute for blind artisans under the supervision of the Wisconsin school for the blind.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 46.05 and section 47.05 of the statutes are amended to read: (46.05) (1) The board shall annually appoint for each hospital for the insane a superintendent, one assistant physician, a matron, and a steward; for the state reformatory a superintendent, an assistant superintendent, and a steward; for the central state hospital, the school for the blind, the school for the deaf, and the industrial school for boys, each a superintendent and a steward; for the industrial home for women a superintendent and a steward, who shall be women; for \* \* the industrial school for girls, the tuberculosis sanatoriums, and the state tuberculosis camp, each a superintendent; for the state public school, and the homes for the feeble-minded, each a superintendent, a steward, and a matron; and for the state prison a warden, a steward, a deputy warden, a chaplain, and a

matron. The duties of said officers shall be fixed by said board, except as otherwise provided by law; but the board may combine the functions and duties of superintendent or warden and steward in one person at any of said institutions except the state hospitals for the insane.

47.05 The state board of control is directed to make provisions for the leasing of such suitable buildings or apartments as may be necessary, for the use of the Wisconsin institute for blind artisans, to provide for the heating and lighting of such buildings or apartments and for such water as may be necessary to be used therein. The rent of such buildings or apartments and the cost of such heating, lighting and water shall be paid by the state under the direction of the board of control. The board is also authorized to furnish to such artisans as avail themselves of the privileges of said institute, a limited amount of materials and tools required in their employments. After July 1, 1925, the Wisconsin institute for blind artisans shall be operated by the state board of control under the supervision of the Wisconsin school for the blind.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 403.

AN ACT to create sections 168.095 and 168.096 of the statutes, relating to gasoline inspection and providing penalties.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Two new sections are added to the statutes to read: 168.095 No person shall sell or offer for sale any gasoline or similar motor vehicle fuel, excepting kerosene, which shall when tested by distillation method 100.12 of the United States Government Standard Specifications (as given in United States Bureau of Mines Technical Paper 323A) give temperatures higher than the following:

(a) When ten per cent is distilled over, the temperature shall not exceed one hundred eighty-five degrees Fahrenheit.
