dollars for an air compressor; one thousand five hundred dollars for remodelling the employes' dining room; two thousand dollars for an X-ray machine; and twenty thousand dollars for the construction of an addition to the power house and for the purchase and installation of power plant equipment.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 34.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 56.08 of the statutes, relating to employment of prisoners in a county jail.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 56.08 of the statutes is amended to read: (56.08) (1) In any county having no workhouse any person, and in all other counties any female person, convicted of any offense and sentenced to imprisonment in the county jail shall be committed to hard labor; provided that the court may order the imprisonment, or a part thereof, to be in actual and ordinary confinement, unless the jail to which the commitment is made shall have been declared inadequate or unfit by the state board of control pursuant to section 46.17. Every such prisoner, for such period of time as he may have been sentenced to hard labor, shall be required to do and perform any suitable labor provided for by the sheriff anywhere within said county; but the hours of labor in farm work shall be not less than ten nor more than twelve hours, and in all other work not more than ten hours, each day.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
