Resolved, That said committee shall from time to time during the present session of the legislature report bills for the repeal of obsolete laws now a part of the statutes of Wisconsin.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to appointment of a legislative committee to represent the state in matters relating to permanent flood control of the Mississippi River.

WHEREAS, The present flood conditions of the Mississippi Valley make it evident that something must be done to permanently control future floods in that region, and

WHEREAS, On or about June 1, 1927, in the city of Chicago, a conference of mayors, governors, congressmen and army engineers will be held to consult and make recommendations to congress relative to future flood control, and

WHEREAS, There will doubtless be other conferences of similar nature held during the recess of this legislature, and

WHEREAS, It is proper that the State of Wisconsin be represented at these conferences, therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That a legislative committee, consisting of two senators and three assemblymen to be appointed by the presiding officers of the respective houses, be created to represent Wisconsin at the conference at Chicago and at such other conferences as may be held relating to the permanent control of floods in the Mississippi Valley. Be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution suitably attested by the proper officers be forwarded to the President of the United States and to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the special joint committee on water powers.

WHEREAS, Joint Resolution No. 5, A., providing for a special joint committee on water power, has been agreed to by a majority of the members of both houses of this legislature, and

WHEREAS, It is now so late in the session that it is manifestly impossible for this committee to complete its work within the time that this legislature will be in session, now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That the special joint committee on water powers, appointed pursuant to Joint Resolution No. 5, A., be and it is hereby continued as an interim committee of this legislature and the final report of the committee, together with any proposed bills which it may recommend, shall be presented to the legislature of 1929 at the opening of the session.
