titling him to teach in any public school; provided that this last requirement shall not disqualify any person who held the office of county superintendent on June 30, 1929.

AN ACT to create paragraph (i) to subsection (14) of section 20.17 of the statutes, relating to an appropriation for the industrial school for girls.

A new paragraph (i) is added to subsection (14) of section 20.17 of the statutes to read: (20.17) (14) (i) On March 1, 1929, ten thousand dollars to be used as a revolving appropriation for operation, maintenance, and permanent property and improvements of the farm on the site purchased for the new industrial school for girls.

## CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 29.28 of the statutes, relating to ice fishing in Brown's lake, Waukesha county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 29.28 of the statutes is amended to read: (29.28) (1) No person shall take, catch or kill fish of any variety through the ice on Pardeeville mill pond in the town of Wyocena, or on Dates mill pond in Columbia county, or on Lake Wisconsin in Columbia and Sauk counties, in the artificial lake formed by the Cedar Falls dam in Dunn county, in Lilly lake in Kenosha county; in Pigeon lake and Little Pigeon
