Johnson and his sureties on his official bond, which suit was decided in favor of the said Henry Johnson; provided, that payment of the sum provided herein shall be in full satisfaction of all claims of Henry Johnson against the state of Wisconsin and that he shall sign a written satisfaction before being paid the sum provided herein.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 205

AN ACT to amend subsection (5) of section 62.24 of the statutes, relating to the establishment of police courts in cities of the second class.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 62.24 of the statutes is amended to read: (62.24) (5) This section shall not apply to cities having a court or judge with substantially the same jurisdiction as that conferred by subsection (2); provided, however, any city of the second class, within which a municipal court is located, having a jurisdiction in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars in civil cases, may, by ordinance, establish a police court, as provided in this section, and thereupon the jurisdiction of such municipal court shall not be deemed to include offenses against ordinances of such city and the police court thus created shall be vested with the jurisdiction specified in subsection (2). Whenever such police court is established, the mayor may appoint a police justice to serve until the next city election. Such police justice in such cities of the second class shall be a duly licensed attorney.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
