The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. In any city of the first class, when the term of office of any justice of the peace or constable expires in a year when there is no regular municipal election, said justice of the peace and constable shall be elected at the next preceding regular election where either municipal officers or members of the school board are to be elected. In the event that a justice of the peace or constable is so elected their respective terms of office shall commence at the expiration of the terms of the then incumbents.

SECTION 2. This act shall be amendatory of the charters of all cities of the first class, and any provision in any such charter which is in conflict with or inconsistent with this act is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 3.

AN ACT relating to expert and clerical assistants or other expenses for the Joint Committee on Finance, and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The Joint Committee on Finance of the legislature of the session of 1929 is empowered to employ trained experts in accounting and statistics, and such other assistants as may be necessary; such experts and assistants shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter 16 and subsection (1) of section 13.14 of the statutes.

Section 2. There is appropriated out of the general fund for the legislative session of 1929 a sum sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act not to exceed ten thousand dollars, to be paid upon the approval and order of the chairman of the senate and assembly divisions of the Joint Committee on Finance, said appropriation to be available for any bills incurred for help or other expenses by the Joint Finance Committee since the date of its organization.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
