CHAPTER 400.

AN ACT to repeal all of section 29.18, except subsection (2), and section 29.19; to renumber subsection (2) of section 29.18 to be section 29.181, and to create two new sections to be numbered 29.18 and 29.19 of the statutes, relating to close seasons for wild animals, birds and fish.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All of section 29.18, except subsection (2) thereof, and section 29.19 of the statutes are repealed.

SECTION 2. Subsection (2) of section 29.18 of the statutes is renumbered to be section 29.181.

Section 3. Two new sections are added to the statutes to be numbered and to read: 29.18 A close season is established for each variety of wild animals and birds named herein, extending during all the time in each year except the open season period embraced within the dates, both inclusive, specified for each variety and each locality, respectively; and except as expressly provided in this chapter, no persons shall hunt or trap any such wild animal or bird at any time other than the open season therefor, nor in the open season in excess of the number designated for each variety or each locality, respectively, nor wild birds of more than one variety, except a mixed bag limit of twenty each day in the open season, but containing not more than the bag limit of any one variety. Wild ducks and coots or mud hens shall be deemed, collectively, one variety.

CHAPTER 401.

AN ACT to create subsection (1a) of section 81.14 of the statutes, relating to county line highways.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 81.14 of the statutes to be numbered and to read: (81.14) (1a) If any county refuses, fails or neglects to aid in putting in reasonable condition for travel any public highway which is a county line highway, the adjoining county or counties may, after not less than twenty days notice in writing has been given to the county
