CHAPTER 368.

AN ACT to repeal and recreate section 6.01 of the statutes, relating to suffrage.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 6.01 of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. A new section is added to the statutes to be numbered and to read: 6.01 The qualifications for suffrage in this state shall be those prescribed in article III of the constitution with the following additions authorized by the constitution and the nineteenth amendment to the constitution of the United States:

(1) Women shall be entitled to vote on the same conditions as men.

(2) Only ten days' residence within the election district where the elector offers to vote shall be required.

(3) No person who shall have made or become interested, directly or indirectly, in any bet or wager depending upon the result of any election at which he shall offer to vote shall be permitted to vote at such election; and any person who shall have been convicted of bribery, shall be excluded from the right of suffrage unless restored to civil rights.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 369.

AN ACT to create subsection (5) of section 85.45 of the statutes, relating to the hauling of inflammable liquids in motor vehicles.
