

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 40.775 (1) No discrimination shall be practiced in the employment of teachers in public schools because of their race, nationality or political or religious affiliations, and no questions of any nature or form shall be asked applicants for teaching positions in the public schools relative to their race, nationality or political or religious affiliations, either by public school officials or employes or by teachers' agencies and placement bureaus.

(2) Any person who shall violate the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than five days nor more than thirty days. Violation of this section shall be cause for the removal of any superintendent, member of a board of education or school board, or other public school official.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 13.

AN ACT to create section 278.18 of the statutes, relating to the exercise of the equitable jurisdiction of courts in foreclosure actions.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. One section is added to the statutes to read: 278.18 DETERMINATION OF VALUE AT TIME OF JUDGMENT. Before sale in any action for the foreclosure of a mortgage in which judgment shall be entered prior to January 1, 1938, the court shall exercise its equitable powers and shall, at the time of the rendition of judgment or at any time thereafter before sale, upon the application of any party in interest, determine and fix the value of the mortgaged premises.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
