

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 352.087 No person shall, himself, or by his servant or agent, or as the servant or agent of any other person, advertise for sale any article of food in package form when the retail price is mentioned in such advertisement unless the actual weight or volume of the contents of such package as stated on the label shall be plainly and conspicuously set forth in such advertisement in not less than ten point type. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or be imprisoned in the county jail not less than thirty days nor more than sixty days.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 194.

AN ACT to create subsection (4) of section 20.57 and section 101.33 of the statutes, relating to the acceptance of funds made available by the federal government for unemployment relief, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 20.57 and a new section is added to the statutes to read: (20.57) (4) FEDERAL RELIEF FUNDS. All moneys made available to the state and accepted by the legislature or governor pursuant to section 101.33 are, as such moneys become available for unemployment or other emergency relief or for public works (other than highway construction) to be undertaken to relieve unemployment, to be distributed and expended as required by the several acts of congress making such funds available and the rules and regulations issued thereunder by the federal authorities in whom the administration of these acts shall be vested. No part of such funds shall be used for administration except as may be specifically provided in such acts of congress or as authorized and approved by the governor.

101.33 (1) The legislature hereby accepts the provisions of an act of congress, approved July 21, 1932, entitled "An act to re-

lieve destitution, to broaden the lending powers of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and to create employment by providing for and expediting a public works program", cited as the "Emergency Relief and Construction Act of 1932".

(2) The legislature hereby approves, ratifies and confirms all past acts of the governor in accepting funds for the state pursuant to the provisions of said "Emergency Relief and Construction Act of 1932".

(3) The governor is authorized to accept for the state at all times when the legislature is not in session the provisions of any act of congress whereby funds are made available to the state for unemployment or other emergency relief or public works to be undertaken to relieve unemployment.

(4) All moneys and credits now in the hands of trustees appointed by the governor pursuant to the "Emergency Relief and Construction Act of 1932" shall upon the taking effect of this section be paid into the general fund of the state treasury and all moneys hereafter paid to the state by the federal government pursuant to this section shall immediately upon receipt be paid into the general fund.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 195.

AN ACT to create subsection (1a) of section 40.07 of the statutes relating to school district boards.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 40.07 of the statutes to read: (40.07) (1a) Any school district with a population of five thousand or more and containing within its boundaries an incorporated village may, at any annual school district meeting or at any special school district meeting called for such specific purpose, by resolution adopted by a majority of the ballots cast in favor of such resolution, substitute for its district board consisting of three members a board consisting of five members to be elected at the next ensuing annual meeting or at the next ensuing annual referendum election as follows: The two members
