CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT to create section 13a of chapter 218, Laws of 1923, relating to criminal jurisdiction of the county court of Wood county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to chapter 218, laws of 1923, to be numbered and to read: (Chapter 218, Laws of 1923) Section 13a. Any person charged with a misdemeanor or felony and who shall have been bound over for trial, to the circuit court of Wood county, may upon application to the county court, be arraigned and allowed to plead guilty before said county court. The judge of the county court, shall accept the plea of guilty of the person charged with the offense, and shall award sentence thereon.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 287.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 29.61 of the statutes, relating to the paying of a bounty on injurious animals.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 29.61 of the statutes is amended to read: (29.61) (1) The governing body of any county, town, city or village * * may direct that every person who shall kill any crow shall be entitled to a reward of not to exceed twenty-five cents, or any sharp-shinned or Cooper's hawk twentyfive cents, or any pocket gopher twenty-five cents, or any streaked gopher ten cents, or any black, brown, gray or Norway rat, commonly known as the house rat or barn rat five cents, or any rattlesnake fifty cents, or any ground hog or woodchuck twenty-five cents, or any mole ten cents.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
