CHAPTER 496.

AN ACT to amend subsections (1) and (2) of section 29.62 of the statutes, relating to the removal of injurious rough fish.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 29.62 are amended to read: (29.62) (1) (as amended in chapter 156, laws of 1933) The state conservation commission is authorized to take rough fish by means of seines only, or cause the same to be so taken, from any of the inland waters of this state other than those specified in subsection (2), whenever it shall find that such fish are detrimental to, retard the propagation of, or destroy game fish therein, except that nets may be used in Lakes Winnebago, Winneconne, Poygan, Butte des Morts, Little Butte des Morts. Puckaway, the Wolf and Fox rivers and in any lakes located in counties which are entirely north of forty-four degrees thirty minutes north latitude, and all waters of Dodge county. In waters requiring the removal of snags, stumps, stones or other obstructions the conservation commission is authorized to contract for a term of years with fishermen who will remove and clean up such lake and river bottoms to permit the seining of rough fish.

(2) The authority granted to the commission by subsection (1) does not extend to the Mississippi river, Lake Wisconsin and the Wisconsin river below said lake as far as the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad near the mouth of said river, Lake Pepin, Lake St. Croix, and the lakes, bays, bayous and sloughs tributary thereto and connected therewith. * *

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
