JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the use of dairy products and eggs in relief administration.

WHEREAS, Wisconsin is the foremost dairy state in the union, and produces large quantities of milk, butter, cheese and eggs for which there is now no profitable market; and

WHEREAS, These products are the most wholesome and at present prices also the most economical food products that can possibly be supplied; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That the legislature of Wisconsin hereby urges all counties and other municipalities which furnish relief to any families dependent upon the public for support to supply to such families an amount of milk, butter, cheese and eggs equal to that which they would use in normal times when they were self-supporting. Be it further

Resolved, That the industrial commission is hereby requested and instructed to advise all relief authorities in this state of this request of the legislature, and to do everything possible to secure compliance therewith in the administration of outdoor relief in this state. Be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the industrial commission, with the request that it convey the content of this resolution to all relief authorities in this state.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to consolidation of governmental functions in counties having a population of two hundred fifty thousand or more.

WHEREAS, There is public demand and great need for economy in government generally and particularly in Milwaukee county; and

WHEREAS, Section 59.083 of the statutes provides that the county board of each county with a population of two hundred fifty thousand or more and governing boards of the cities, towns

and villages in said counties are vested with powers sufficient to enable them to provide for a consolidation of governmental functions in such counties; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee county comes within the classification prescribed by section 59.083 of the statutes; and

WHEREAS, The consolidation of governmental functions in Milwaukee county under section 59.083 of the statutes would result in reducing duplication of governmental agencies in performing certain functions and in great saving to the taxpayers in the cost of government; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That the county board of Milwaukee county, and the governing boards of the several towns, cities and villages in said county be requested to meet at once, either by representation of the entire governing boards or by proper committees thereof, to devise ways and means of putting into effect and operation the consolidation of governmental functions contemplated by section 59.083 of the statutes; be it further

Resolved, That the chairman of the county board of Milwaukee county be requested to call such meeting within fifteen days after the passage of this resolution; be it further

Resolved, That copies of this joint resolution certified to by the secretary of state be forwarded to the chairman of the county board of Milwaukee county and to each mayor, village president and town chairman in said county.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to pensions for Spanish-American War veterans and the disabled veterans of the World War.

WHEREAS, The National Economy Act (Public Law No. 2, 73rd Congress, 1st Session) cut off from all allowances by the federal government all disabled veterans of the Spanish-American War, the Boxer Rebellion, the Philippine Insurrection and the World War who cannot establish that their disabilities resulted from war service; and

WHEREAS, This is particularly unjust in the case of the veterans of the Spanish-American War, the Boxer Rebellion and the
