CHAPTER 100.

AN ACT relating to the transfer of possession and control to the conservation commission of certain lands in the bed of Beaver Dam lake for harbor and other conservation purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

The lands constituting the bed of Beaver Dam lake at the easterly boundary of the lake in the city of Beaver Dam, Dodge county, hereinafter described, are set aside to the conservation commission to be used for the creation of a harbor and wharves and for other conservation purposes in connection with the state fish camp, Beaver Dam, Wisconsin, namely: beginning at a point which is 486.7 feet west of and 100 feet south of the N. E. section corner of section 32, T. 12 N, R. 14 E, town of Beaver Dam, Dodge county, Wisconsin, said starting point being 38 feet east of the shore line of Beaver Dam lake; thence due west parallel to the north line of section 32 a distance of approximately 262 feet to a point; thence S 59° - °' W. a distance of approximately 399 feet to a point; thence \$ 16° - 30' E a distance of approximately 528 feet to a point which is 6 feet west of the shore line of Beaver Dam lake; thence S 76° 30' E a distance of approximately 267 feet; thence N 13° 30' E a distance of 800 feet to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 101.

AN ACT relating to expert and clerical assistants or other expenses for the joint committee on finance and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The joint committee on finance of the legislature of 1941 is empowered to employ trained experts in accounting and statistics, and such other assistants as may be

necessary; such experts and assistants shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter 16 and subsection (1) of section 13.14 of the statutes.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general fund for the necessary expenses of the joint committee on finance of the legislature of 1941 and to carry out the provisions of this act not to exceed \$4,000, to be paid upon the approval and order of the chairman of the senate and assembly divisions of the joint committee on finance, said appropriation to be available for any bills incurred for help or other expenses by the joint finance committee since the date of its organization.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 102.

AN ACT to create 16.275 (3) and 16.351 of the statutes, relating to civil service status and seniority rights of classified civil service employes, of the state and of counties having a population of 250,000 or more, entering military service.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (3) of section 16.275 of the statutes is created to read:

(16.275) (3) Any classified employe, including any employe who has served at least 3 months of his probationary period, who is now or hereafter becomes an active member of the military or naval forces of the United States, shall be granted a leave of absence to be continued in effect for a period of not more than 3 years plus 90 days, provided, that such employe within 30 days after discharge from such military service shall file his notice in writing with the director of his intention to resume his employment. Service toward permanency, seniority or salary advancement shall be deemed not to be interrupted by such military leave.

SECTION 2. Section 16.351 of the statutes is created to read: 16.351 RIGHTS OF EMPLOYES IN MILITARY SERVICE.
