CHAPTER 287.

AN ACT to amend 300.02 of the statutes, relating to where a justice of the peace of a town may keep his office.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

300.02 of the statutes is amended to read:

300.02 Every justice of the peace shall keep his office in the town for which he may be elected, * * * *except that he may keep such office in a village or city of the fourth class lying wholly within such town, but he may issue process at any place in the county.*

CHAPTER 288.

AN ACT to create 20.43 (4m) and 140.05 (12) of the statutes, relating to the duties of the state board of health as to certain records, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.43 (4m) of the statutes is created to read:

20.43 (4m) COPIES OF RECORDS. All fees and receipts of moneys collected under section 140.05 (12) by any state official or employe shall be paid within one week into the state treasury and are appropriated therefrom for the execution of its functions thereunder.

SECTION 2. 140.05 (12) of the statutes is created to read:

140.05 (12) The board may make transcripts of such records for the United States Census Bureau, the Social Security Board and other governmental agencies upon their request and payment of the fees mutually agreed upon.
