gress, shall not be included as a part of the year necessary to acquire a legal settlement in such city, village or town nor after said date shall the time spent in such service by any person, who had a legal settlement in any city, village or town of this state at the time of his entrance or induction into such service, be included within the year necessary to lose such legal settlement.

CHAPTER 414.

AN ACT to amend 85.40 (10) of the statutes, relating to the maximum permissible speed of certain heavy vehicles during the emergency.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

85.40 (10) of the statutes is amended to read:

85.40 (10) Subject to the regulations of this section, no vehicle or combination of vehicles, except busses, having a gross weight of more than 10,000 pounds shall be operated at a speed greater than 35 miles per hour, except that for the duration of the present war and for 6 months after its termination, as proclaimed by the President or the Congress of the United States, the maximum permissible speed shall not be greater than as prescribed by rules and regulations of the proper federal agency.

CHAPTER 415.

AN ACT to amend 61.32 of the statutes, relating to publication of proceedings of village board.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

61.32 of the statutes is amended to read:

61.32 The trustees of each village shall constitute a board designated the "Village Board of" (name of village) in which

shall be vested all the powers of the village not specifically given some other officer. Four trustees shall constitute a quorum, except in villages having a population of 350 or less, but a less number may adjourn from time to time. The president shall preside at all meetings when present. In his absence the board may select another trustee to preside. Regular meetings shall be held at such time as may be prescribed by their by-laws. meetings may be called by any 2 trustees in writing, filed with the clerk, who shall thereupon seasonably notify all the trustees of the time and place thereof in the manner directed by the bylaws. All meetings shall be open to the public. The board shall keep a record of all its proceedings, and if there be a newspaper published in any village, * * * the board shall cause the proceedings to be published therein in such manner as the board shall direct. Nothing herein shall be construed as requiring the republication of any proceeding, ordinance or other matter or thing which has already been published according to law, nor shall anything herein be construed to relieve any village from publishing any proceeding, ordinance or other matter or thing required by law to be published. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 331.25 (2) the fee for any such publication shall not exceed \$1 per folio. The board shall have power to preserve order at its meetings, compel attendance of trustees and punish nonattendance and it shall be judge of the election and qualification of its members. The president and board of trustees of any village, whether operating under general or special law, may by a three-fourths vote of all the members of the village board determine that an annual salary be paid the president and trustees. Salaries heretofore established shall so remain until changed by ordinance and shall not be increased or diminished during their terms of office.
