## CHAPTER 295.

AN ACT to amend 97.39 (3) of the statutes, relating to powdered skim milk, buttermilk and whole milk and standard for certain milk products.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

97.39 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

97.39 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, by himself, his servant or agent, or as the servant or agent of another, to sell or exchange, or expose for sale or exchange, or have in possession with intent to sell or exchange, any condensed or evaporated \* \* \* skim milk in containers holding less than 10 pounds avoirdupois net weight except that powdered skim milk, powdered buttermilk or powdered whole milk may be sold in containers of any size, and each said container shall bear the name and address of the manufacturer, distinctly branded, indented, labeled or printed thereon, together with the words \* \* " "powdered skim milk", or "powdered buttermilk", or "powdered whole milk", as the case may be, in Roman letters of a size larger than any other words or letters appearing on said brand, indentation or label.

## CHAPTER 296.

AN ACT to amend 146.11 (1) of the statutes, relating to slaughterhouses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

146.11 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

146.11 (1) In this section "slaughterhouse" means a place where cattle, swine, sheep, goats or horses are killed or dressed for human consumption, except the following: slaughterhouses under federal inspection unless included in the context, slaughtering or dressing by farmers of animals produced on their own farms and occasional killing by individuals for their own use; "board" means the state board of health.
