SECTION 2. CHAPTER 363.

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 328.01 of the statutes, relating to judicial notice of the laws of other jurisdictions and proof. thereof, and to make uniform the law with reference thereto.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

328.01 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read: 328.01 JUDICIAL NOTICE OF FOREIGN LAWS. (1) COURTS TAKE NOTICE. Every court of this state shall take ju-

dicial notice of the common law and statutes of every state, territory and other jurisdiction of the United States.

(2) INFORMATION OF THE COURT. The court may inform itself of such laws in such manner as it may deem proper, and the court may call upon counsel to aid it in obtaining such information.

(3) DETERMINED BY COURT; RULING REVIEWABLE. The determination of such laws shall be made by the court and not by the jury, and shall be reviewable.

(4) EVIDENCE OF FOREIGN LAWS. Any party may also present to the trial court any admissible evidence of such laws, but, to enable a party to offer evidence of the law in another jurisdiction or to ask that judicial notice be taken thereof, reasonable notice shall be given to the adverse parties either in the pleadings or otherwise.

(5) FOREIGN COUNTRY. The law of a jurisdiction other than those referred to in subsection (1) shall be an issue for the court, but shall not be subject to the foregoing provisions concerning judicial notice.

(6) INTERPRETATION. This act shall be so interpreted as to make uniform the law of those states which enact it.

(7) SHORT TITLE. This act may be cited as the Uniform Judicial Notice of Foreign Law Act.

CHAPTER 364.

AN ACT to repeal 60.33 (5) and to amend 60.60 of the statutes, relating to the compensation of town officers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 60.33 (5) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. 60.60 of the statutes is amended to read:

60.60 The compensation of town supervisors and town treasurer shall be \$4 per day unless a different sum per day is fixed by the annual town meeting. In lieu of per diem compensation the annual town meeting may fix a salary for the town supervisors and the town treasurer. Supervisors of towns situ-
