CHAPTER 19.

AN ACT to create section 15 of chapter 193, laws of 1951, relating to the judge of the municipal court for the western district of Waukesha county as court commissioner.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 15 of chapter 193, laws of 1951, is created to read:

(Chapter 193, laws of 1951) SECTION 15. The judge of said court shall have and may exercise in his county all the powers and perform all the duties of a court commissioner as defined in s. 252.15 of the statutes; and every authority granted to, or limitation of the powers of, a court commissioner by the statutes shall be construed to extend to said judge, acting in such capacity except when otherwise expressly provided. The fees received by him and to which he would otherwise be entitled to retain for his own use, shall be paid three-fourths into the county treasury of Waukesha county and one-fourth into the city treasury of the city of Oconomowoc. The judge shall keep an accurate statement of such fees collected and file the same in the county clerk's office and a copy thereof in the office of the city clerk of the city of Oconomowoc at the end of each month and shall at the same time pay over all such money as provided in this section.
