### CHAPTER 532

AN ACT to create 15.64 (8), 20.10 (12) and 35.84 (13) of the statutes, relating to the publication of an inventory of Wisconsin natural resources by the natural resources committee of state agencies, and making an appropriation.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 15.64 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

15.64 (8) To sell copies of the inventory of Wisconsin natural resources at cost, plus 20 per cent. The proceeds of such sales shall be paid within one week into the general fund.

SECTION 2. 20.10 (12) of the statutes is created to read:

20.10 (12) On July 1, 1955, \$16,000 as a nonlapsible appropriation to print and distribute the inventory of Wisconsin natural resources as prepared for printing by the natural resources committee of state agencies.

SECTION 3. 35.84 (13) of the statutes is created to read:

35.84 (13) Of the inventory of Wisconsin natural resources: to each constitutional officer, 2 copies; to each member of the current legislature if receipt by the director of purchases is prior to January 1 of an even-numbered year, otherwise to each member of the incoming legislature, one copy, provided that each such member may requisition 2 additional free copies; to each member of the supreme court, one copy; to each member and member-elect of the U. S. congress, one copy; to each member of the natural resources committee and its working groups, one copy; to each public library, one copy; to each high school library, one copy plus one additional copy to each high school library in third class cities, 2 additional copies to each high school library in second class cities, and 3 additional copies to each high school library in cities of the first class; to the libraries of the state university and its extension centers, a total of 50 copies; to each library of the state colleges, 5 copies; to Marquette university library, 20 copies; to each private educational institution of college rank, 5 copies; to the state historical society, 5 copies; to the legislative reference library, 10 copies; and to the free library commission, 10 copies; provided, that further free distribution may be made to the libraries of other educational institutions within the state, to each as provided by this section for libraries of comparable public educational institutions. Such free distribution shall be made following a request approved by the natural resources committee of state agencies or its authorized officer. The total free distribution authorized by this section shall not exceed 2,000 copies.
