CHAPTER 657

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 161.01 (14) of the statutes, defining narcotic drugs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

161.01 (14) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

161.01 (14) "Narcotic drugs" means any of the following, whether produced directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of natural origin, or independently by means of chemical synthesis, or a combination of extraction and chemical synthesis: opium, meperidine, methadone, methadol, alphaprodine (Nisentil), heptazone, keto-bemidone, levorphan, coca leaves, cannabis and any other drug found by the state board of health after due notice and opportunity for public hearing to possess addiction potentialities similar to those drugs listed herein, and proclaimed by the governor to have been so found by the board, and any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative or preparation of the foregoing. The board is authorized to issue necessary rules and regulations for carrying out this subsection.
