CHAPTER 658

- AN ACT to renumber 161.06 (1); to amend 161.08 (1); and to create 161.06 (1) (b) and (c) and 161.08 (2) (c) of the statutes, relating to narcotics.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
 - SECTION 1. 161.06 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 161.06 (1) (a).
- SECTION 2. 161.06 (1) (b) and (c) of the statutes are created to read:

- 161.06 (1) (b) In lieu of a written prescription for such narcotic drugs or compounds of a narcotic drug found to possess relatively little or no addiction liability by the U. S. commissioner of narcotics pursuant to the federal narcotics laws, the sale, dispensing or distribution may be made by a pharmacist to a consumer upon oral prescription of a physician, dentist or veterinarian. Such oral prescription shall be promptly reduced to writing by the pharmacist and such writing filed and preserved in the manner and containing the same information as required for a written prescription under par. (a). An oral prescription shall not be refilled. Sections 161.09 (3) and (5), 161.10 (2) and 161.17 shall apply to all sales upon oral prescriptions.
 - (c) The provisions of this subsection shall apply to paregoric.

SECTION 3. 161.08 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

161.08 (1) Administering, dispensing or selling at retail of any medicinal preparation that contains in one fluid ounce * * * not more than one grain of codeine or any of its salts, or not more than one-sixth grain of dihydrocodeinone or any of its salts.

SECTION 4. 161.08 (2) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

161.08 (2) (c) That such preparation shall be sold at retail only by a registered pharmacist when sold in a retail establishment.
