CHAPTER 176

AN ACT to renumber and amend 20.840 (61); and to create 20.005 (2) (a) (line 846a) and 20.840 (61) (b) and (70) of the statutes, relating to erection and equipment of a domiciliary infirmary at King, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.005 (2) (a) (line 846a) of the statutes is created to read:

20.005 (2) (a)

846a. Domiciliary infirmary (70) 1957-58 1,500,000

SECTION 2. 20.840 (61) of the statutes is renumbered 20.840 (61) (a) and amended to read:

20.840 (61) (a) From the general fund annually, beginning July 1, 1943, for a period of * * * 30 years, all moneys received by the state from the federal government as aid for veterans of any war or military expedition of the United States who have been admitted to and are cared for at the Grand Army home for veterans as a nonlapsible appropriation, to be used by the department exclusively for the erection of a modern building or buildings or adequate housing facilities, inclusive of such other land as may be necessary therefor, and equipment at said home to replace the present inadequate and dangerous housing accommodations.

SECTION 3. 20.840 (61) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

20.840 (61) (b) Transfer to state building trust fund. There is transferred as of June 30, 1957, from the general fund to the state building trust fund all moneys credited to the department of veterans' affairs under par. (a), and, annually beginning June 30 thereafter, there is transferred to the state building trust fund the net revenues accruing under par. (a) until such time as the \$1,500,000 appropriation created by sub. (70) has been completely reimbursed.

SECTION 4. 20.840 (70) of the statutes is created to read:

20.840 (70) DOMICILIARY INFIRMARY AT KING. For the purpose of erecting and equipping a fireproof domiciliary infirmary of approximately 250 bed capacity at the Grand Army home at King, there is appropriated on July 1, 1957, to the department of veterans' affairs \$1,500,000 from the state building trust fund.
