CHAPTER 109

AN ACT to amend 97.046 (6) (a) of the statutes, as created by chapter 443, laws of 1957, relating to grade A milk regulations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

97.046 (6) (a) of the statutes, as created by chapter 443, laws of 1957, is amended to read:

97.046 (6) (a) Regulation of the production, processing and distribution of grade A milk and grade A milk products under minimum sanitary requirements which are uniform throughout the state and the United States is essential for the protection of consumers and the economic well-being of the dairy industry, and is therefore a matter

of state-wide concern; however, nothing in this section shall impair or abridge the power of any municipality or county to regulate milk or milk products, * * * *under sanitary requirements and standards which are in reasonable accord with those issued under this section or the power to impose license and permit fees not to exceed \$25 and inspection fees which shall not exceed the reasonable and necessary cost of regulation and inspection. No municipality or county shall impose license, permit or inspection fees on the producer or processor of milk which has been produced or processed as grade A milk under supervision of the state department of agriculture or another municipality which has received an approved sanitation rating by the state board of health. Nothing herein shall prohibit a municipality from providing for the regulation and inspection of the distributors of such milk but the same restrictions on fees shall apply.*
