## CHAPTER 325

## AN ACT to amend 59.07 (75); and to create 60.29 (45) of the statutes, relating to county and town industrial agencies and powers of county and town authorities.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 59.07 (75) of the statutes is amended to read:

59.07 (75) May appropriate money for and create a county industrial development agency or to any nonprofit agency organized to engage or engaging in activities hereinafter enumerated, except in counties having a population of 500,000 or more no appropriation may be made to such a nonprofit agency, appoint an executive officer and provide a staff and facilities to promote and develop the resources of the county and of its component towns and municipalities. To this end the agency may, without restriction because of enumeration, develop data regarding the industrial needs, advantages and sites in the county, acquaint the purchaser with the products of the county by promotional activities, co-ordinate its work with that of the county planning commission, the state department of resource development and private credit development corporations and to do all things necessary to provide for the continued improvement of the industrial climate of the county.

SECTION 2. 60.29 (45) of the statutes is created to read:

60.29 (45) TOWN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY. May appropriate money for and create a town industrial development agency or to any nonprofit agency organized to engage or engaging in activities hereinafter enumerated, appoint an executive officer and provide a staff and facilities to promote and develop the resources of the town. To this end the agency may, without restriction because of enumeration, develop data regarding the industrial needs, advantages and sites in the town, acquaint the purchaser with the products of the town by promotional activities, co-ordinate its work with that of the county planning commission, the state department of resource development and private credit development corporations and to do all things necessary to provide for the continued improvement of the industrial climate of the town.
