Chapter 630

AN ACT to amend 103.49 (1); and to create 103.49 (6) of the statutes, relating to wage rate on state work.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 103.49 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

103.49 (1) ~~Each~~ Any contract involving \$1,000 or more hereafter made for the erection, construction, remodeling or repairing of any public building or for any other project of public works, except contracts for the construction or maintenance of public highways and bridges, to which the state, any department thereof or any public building corporation is a party shall contain a stipulation that no laborer, workman or mechanic employed directly upon the site of the work by the contractor or by any subcontractor, agent or other person, doing or contracting to do all or a part of the work, shall be permitted to work a greater number of hours per day or per calendar week than the prevailing hours of labor determined pursuant to this section, except that any such laborer, workman or mechanic may be permitted or required to work more than such prevailing number of hours per day and per calendar week if he is paid for all hours in excess of the prevailing hours at a rate of at least 1½ times his hourly basic rate of pay; nor shall he be paid less than the prevailing wage rate in the same or most similar trade or occupation in the area wherein such public building or project of public works is situated. The prevailing wage rates, prevailing hours of labor, and hourly basic rates of pay determined pursuant to this section, shall be set forth specifically in the contract.

SECTION 2. 103.49 (6) of the statutes is created to read:

103.49 (6) This section shall not apply to a contract, or to work under a contract, described or referred to in sub. (1) under which: (a) the estimated total cost of completing the project is less than \$2,500 and only one trade or occupation is required to complete it, or (b) the estimated total cost of completing the project is less than \$25,000 and more than one trade or occupation is required to complete it.
