CHAPTER 85, LAWS OF 1967

AN ACT to create 963.10 and 963.11 of the statutes, relating to special inspection warrants.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

963.10 and 963.11 of the statutes are created to read:

963.10 SPECIAL INSPECTION WARRANTS. (1) All state, county, city, village and town officers and their agents and employes, charged under statute or municipal ordinance with powers or duties involving inspection of real or personal property including buildings, building premises and building contents, for, without limitation because of enumeration, such purposes as building, housing, electrical, plumbing, heating, gas, fire, health, safety, environmental pollution, water quality, waterways, use of water, food, zoning, property assessment, meter, and weights and measures inspections and investigations, shall be deemed peace officers for the purpose of applying for, obtaining and executing special inspection warrants under s. 963.11.

(2) Except in cases of emergency where no special inspection warrant shall be required, special inspection warrants shall be issued for inspection of personal or real properties which are not public buildings or for inspection of portions of public buildings which are not open to the public only upon showing that consent to entry for inspection purposes has been refused. The definition of "public building" under s. 101.01 (12) applies to this section.
