CHAPTER 374, LAWS OF 1969

AN ACT to create 16.008; and to amend 20.865 (3) (title) and (a) of the statutes, relating to payment by the state of special charges for extraordinary police service and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 16.008 of the statutes is created to read:

16.008 PAYMENT OF SPECIAL CHARGES BY STATE FOR EXTRAORDINARY POLICE SERVICE. (1) The state shall pay for any ex-

traordinary police service on and in the immediate vicinity of any property owned by or under the control of the state provided at the request of a state officer or agency charged with the operation and preservation of such property, or his or its designee. The payment shall be on the basis of actual additional cost to the municipality or county providing the extraordinary police service for wage and disability payments, pensions and workmen's compensation payments, damage to equipment and clothing, replacement of expendable supplies, medical expense, transportation expense and any other necessary expenses. The clerk of the municipality or county requesting payment from the state shall transmit the itemized statement of charges to the requesting state officer or agency and the state officer or agency shall review the statement and refer it, with recommendations, to the claims board for its consideration. If the claims board finds that payment of the statement of charges, or any part thereof, is proper under this section, it may order the amount paid on its own motion without submission of the claim to the legislature, any provisions of s. 16.007 to the contrary notwithstanding. Such amount shall be paid out of the appropriation made by s. 20.865 (3).

(2) "Extraordinary police services" are those police services which are in addition to those being maintained for normal police service functions by the municipality or county involved and are required because of an assemblage or activity which is or threatens to become a riot, civil disturbance, mob violence or other similar circumstance.

Section 2. 20.865 (3) (title) and (a) of the statutes are amended to read:

20.865 (3) (title) Taxes, Assessments and Special Charges. (a) Property taxes, assessments and special charges. A sum sufficient for the payment of taxes and assessments pursuant to ss. 66.64 and 74.57 and for the payment of special charges for extraordinary police services under s. 16.008.
