CHAPTER 442, LAWS OF 1969

AN ACT to appropriate the sum of \$12,766.10 to the Imperial Lithographing Corp., 914 East Hamilton Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for payment of a claim made by it against the state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

There is appropriated from the general fund to the Imperial Lithographing Corp., formerly Litho-Graphic Corporation, 914 East Hamilton Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, the sum of \$12,766.10 to compensate the corporation for services utilized, exclusive of printing costs, by the state in the preparation of materials for the office of civil defense. During 1958 after the claimant had done substantial work on the preparation of certain complex documents for the so-called survival plan, it was discovered that through no fault of the claimant, the contractual procedures for awarding the contract had not been followed. After negotiations failed to provide a solution, claimant filed a claim for services rendered. In May 1959, the claims commission recommended denial of the claim partly because claimant allegedly had provided nothing to the state and there had been a violation of section 15.60 (7) (now s. 16.75 (7)), Wis. Stats. Actually, the state had used materials prepared by the claimant in a subsequent production of the civil defense publication. The claimant now seeks payment for the services rendered to and material utilized by the state which became part of the operational survival plan finally produced by other printers including editing and copy preparation, layout work, engineering and preparation of evacuation maps. Acceptance of this payment shall act as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such services.
