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CHAPTER 332, Laws of 1971

AN ACT to repeal ~~13.191 (1), 13.193 (1), 15.197 (1) and 20.435 (4) (b) and (c) to amend 46.80 (1)(a) and (b) (intro.) to repeal and recreate 46.80 (1) (a) and (b) and (4); and to create 15.74, 15.741, 20.440 and 46.80 (2) (a)(i) and (3) (a)(i) of the statutes [of the statutes], relating to eliminating the council on aging and the division of aging within the department of health and social services, and creating an independent state board on aging.~~

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

~~SECTION 1. 13.191 (1) of the statutes is repealed.~~

~~SECTION 2. 13.193 (1) of the statutes is repealed.~~

SECTION 3. 15.197 (1) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 4. 15.74 and 15.741 of the statutes are created to read:

15.74 BOARD ON AGING. There is created a board on aging consisting of 7 members appointed for 4-year terms. Members shall be residents of this state who have demonstrated a continuing interest in the problems of aging, and who hold no position or employment with the state. Four such members shall be elderly persons.

~~15.741 SAME. PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITIES.~~ The board on aging shall have the program responsibilities specified for the board under s. 46.80.

~~46.80 (4) STAFF. The board shall appoint a person with an understanding of the problems of the aging to serve outside the classified service as the board's full-time executive director. The board may employ such other necessary clerical and technical staff as is required to carry out the functions of the board.~~

~~SECTION / 12. / WORD CHANGES. / Wherever the word "division" appears in section 46.80 (1) (c), (2) and (3) of the statutes, the word "board" is substituted.~~

~~SECTION 13. TERMS OF INITIAL APPOINTEES. Of the members of the board on aging initially appointed under SECTION 4 of this act, 4 shall be appointed for a term of 2 years and 3 for 4 years.~~

~~SECTION / 15. / TRANSFER / OF / PERSONNEL. / All employees of the division of aging attached to the department of health and social services are transferred to the board on aging.~~

~~SECTION / 16. / TRANSFER / OF / RECORDS. / All records of the division of aging attached to the department of health and social services and all records of the council on aging under section 13.197 (1) of the statutes which is repealed by this act are transferred to the board on aging which is created by this act.~~
