

**CHAPTER 90, Laws of 1975**

AN ACT to amend 6.86 of the statutes, relating to application for absentee ballots.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

6.86 of the statutes is amended to read:

**6.86 Application for absentee ballot.** Any elector, qualifying under ss. 6.20 (1) and 6.85 as an absent elector may apply to the municipal clerk for his official ballot either in writing or in person. If application is made in writing, the application, signed by the elector, shall be received no sooner than the first of the month 3 months before the election nor after 5 p.m. on the ~~Friday day~~ immediately preceding the election. If application is made in person the application shall not be made sooner than the first of the month 3 months before the month of the election nor later than 5 p.m. on the day preceding the election. If the elector is making written application and the reason for requesting an absentee ballot is that the elector is a sequestered juror, the application shall be received no sooner than the first of the month 3 months before the election nor after 12 noon on election day. If the application is received after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately preceding the election, the municipal clerk or his agent shall immediately take the ballot to the court in which the elector is serving as a juror and deposit it with the judge. The judge shall recess his court, as soon as convenient, and give the elector his ballot. The judge shall then notarize the affidavit as provided in s. 6.87 and shall turn the ballot over to the clerk or his agent who shall deliver it to the polling place as required in s. 6.88.

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
