1983 Wisconsin Act 406

AN ACT to repeal 100.15 (2); and to amend 100.15 (1) and 100.15 (3) (b) of the statutes, relating to redemption of trading stamps and similar devices.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 100.15 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

100.15 (1) No person, firm, corporation, or association within this state may use, give, offer, issue, transfer, or furnish, deliver, or cause or authorize to be furnished or delivered to any other person, firm, corporation, or association within this state, in connection with the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise, any trading stamp, token, ticket, bond, or other similar device, which entitles the purchaser receiving the same to procure any goods, wares, merchandise privilege, or thing of value in exchange for any such the trading stamp, token, ticket, bond, or other similar device.

SECTION 2. 100.15 (2) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 3. 100.15 (3) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

100.15 (3) (b) A manufacturer, packer or dealer person who issues a slip, ticket or check trading stamp or other similar device, with the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise, which bears upon its face a stated cash value and is redeemable only in cash for the amount stated, upon presentation in amounts aggregating 25 cents or over of redemption value, and only by the person, firm or corporation issuing the same or in merchandise at the option of the holder.
