## 1985 Wisconsin Act 119

AN ACT to repeal 230.12 (1) (am); to amend 40.05 (2m), 230.35 (4) (b) 1 and 230.35 (4) (c); and to create 230.35 (4) (a) 1m of the statutes, relating to payment of retirement benefit adjustment contributions, length of service payments to state employes, closing state offices on the 3rd Monday in January and granting state employes an additional legal holiday.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 40.05 (2m) of the statutes is amended to read:

40.05 (2m) BENEFIT ADJUSTMENT CONTRIBUTION. In addition to the amounts under subs. (1) and (2), a benefit adjustment contribution equal to one percent of earnings shall be paid by or for participating employes whose formula rate is determined under s. 40.23 (2m) (e) 1 and 3. This contribution shall be deducted from each payment of earnings to participating employes unless the employer provides through its compensation provisions or agreements that all or part of the contribution will be paid by the employer. For benefit purposes, this contribution shall be treated as if it were an employer required contribution regardless of whether the employer or the employe pays the contribution.

SECTION 2. 230.12 (1) (am) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 3. 230.35 (4) (a) 1m of the statutes is created to read:

230.35 (4) (a) 1m. The 3rd Monday in January, which shall be the day of celebration for January 15.

SECTION 4. 230.35 (4) (b) 1 of the statutes is amended to read:

230.35 (4) (b) 1. All work performed on the holidays enumerated in par. (a) 1, 1m and 3 to 9.

SECTION 5. 230.35 (4) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

230.35 (4) (c) All employes except limited term employes shall receive 8.5 9.5 paid holidays annually in addition to any other authorized paid leave, the time to be at the discretion of the appointing authorities.

SECTION 6. Effective date. This act takes effect on January 1, 1986.
