1991 WISCONSIN ACT 47

AN ACT to create 21.70 of the statutes, relating to: national guard involvement in drug interdiction and counter-drug activities.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 21.70 of the statutes is created to read:

21.70 Counter-drug activities. (1) The governor may request volunteers of the national guard to provide assistance to federal, state and local law enforcement officers, within or outside the boundaries of this state, in drug interdiction and counter-drug activities under 32 USC 112. These activities may include the operation and maintenance of equipment and facilities. The governor may order, with their consent, any national guard members who volunteer under this section to duty in federally

funded status. The governor may delegate his or her authority under this section to the adjutant general. The adjutant general shall follow all laws and regulations of the U.S. department of defense when ordering national guard members to perform drug interdiction and counter-drug activities under this section.

(2) A national guard member assisting in drug interdiction and counter-drug activities under this section shall obey and execute the instructions of a law enforcement officer involved in these activities given to the national guard member through the military chain of command.
