1993 WISCONSIN ACT 480

AN ACT *to create* 48.34 (4r) (c), 48.344 (2e) (c), 161.50 (3) and 343.32 (1m) (d) of the statutes, **relating to:** controlled substances violations and motor vehicle operating privileges.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 48.34 (4r) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

48.34 (**4r**) (c) If the child's license or operating privilege is currently suspended or revoked or the child does not currently possess a valid operator's license issued under ch. 343, the suspension or revocation under this subsection is effective on the date on which the child is first eligible and applies for issuance, renewal or reinstatement of an operator's license under ch. 343.

SECTION 2. 48.344 (2e) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

48.344 (2e) (c) If the child's license or operating privilege is currently suspended or revoked or the child does not currently possess a valid operator's license issued under ch. 343, the suspension or revocation under this subsection is effective on the date on which the child is first eligible and applies for issuance, renewal or reinstatement of an operator's license under ch. 343.

SECTION 3. 161.50 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

161.50 (3) If the person's license or operating privilege is currently suspended or revoked or the person does not currently possess a valid operator's license issued under ch. 343, the suspension or revocation under this section is effective on the date on which the person is first eligible and applies for issuance, renewal or reinstatement of an operator's license under ch. 343.

SECTION 4. 343.32 (1m) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

343.32 (1m) (d) If the person's license or operating privilege is currently suspended or revoked or the person does not currently possess a valid operator's license issued under this chapter, the suspension or revocation under this subsection is effective on the date on which the person is first eligible and applies for issuance, renewal or reinstatement of an operator's license under this chapter.

SECTION 5. Initial applicability. This act first applies to violations committed on the effective date of this SECTION, but does not preclude the counting of other violations as prior violations for purposes of imposing dispositional orders under chapter 48 of the statutes or determining eligibility for an occupational license.
