Note: Chapter Ind 69 as it existed on June 30, 1977 was repealed and a new chapter Ind 69 was created effective July 1, 1977.

Ind 69.01 Scope. The fees fixed in this code shall be assessed and collected by the department for inspections, plan examinations and approvals, certifications, registrations, licenses, etc. as outlined in the following sections. The fees shall apply to public buildings and structures; places of employment and components thereof; mobile homes; systems for the storage of anhydrous ammonia, flammable and combustible liquids, liquefied petroleum gas and liquefied natural gas; petroleum products; and all other services and devices for which authority to fix and collect fees is provided in the Wisconsin Statutes.

Note #1: The word "department" referred to in this code means the department of industry, labor and human relations.

Note #2: In accordance with chapter 39, laws of 1975, which became effective July 31, 1975, state and local governments are no longer exempted from the fees indicated in s. 101.19, Stats.

Ind 69.02 Payment of fees. All checks or money orders are to be made payable to Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations; mailing address: P. O. Box 7946, [7969], Madison, Wisconsin 53707. All fees for building plan review and building inspection shall be received by the department before the approval, inspection or other service is provided by the department.

(2) PRESSURE VESSEL FEES. Inspection fees for pressure vessels, operating at a pressure of 15 psig and greater, will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

(3) WISCONSIN SPECIAL VESSEL PLAN EXAMINATION AND APPROVALS. Plans indicating the design, construction details, design computations and specifications for special boilers or pressure vessels shall be submitted for examination and approval. Plan examination and approval fees will be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

(4) REINSPECTION FEE. A fee of \$18.00 shall be assessed for inspections made by the department to gain compliance with the rules of Wis. Adm. Code chapters Ind 41-42, Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code, after orders have been issued by the department.

(5) REGISTRATION FEE. The installing contractor of a new or secondhand boiler or pressure vessel shall register the installation with the department before the installations are placed in operation. The registration fee is \$5.00.

(6) ALTERATION AND REPAIR FEES. An owner reporting alteration or repair to a boiler or pressure vessel, as required by the provisions of Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 42.01 (2), shall remit a fee of \$6.00 with each alteration or repair report.

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(b) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination need not submit an additional examination fee when the application for reexamination is filed within 12 months from the date of the previous examination.

(c) The annual renewal fee for certificates of competency is \$15.00.

(2) INSURANCE COMPANY INSPECTION ASSESSMENTS. The department may inspect any installation which is also inspected by a certified inspector employed by an insurance company or agency. When the department inspection confirms that the insurance inspection report is incomplete, invalid or unacceptable for any reason, the department will assess the insurance company or agency a fee in accordance with the schedules in sections Ind 69.03 or Ind 69.06 (2).

Ind 69.18 Mines, pits and quarries. (1) NOTIFICATION. The owner or operator shall submit with the fee the name of the mine, pit or quarry; the name of the owner and operator; the company name; the mailing address; the type of product to be mined (ore, stone, clay, lime or aggregate); and the estimated date to start operations.

(2) ANNUAL SAFETY INSPECTION SERVICE. The annual safety inspection service fee for each metal or nonmetal mine, pit or quarry shall be based on the size of the respective operation for the previous calendar year.

Annual production

Note #1: This fee includes safety inspections for explosives stored at mines, pits or quarries.

Note #2: This fee does not apply to mines, pits or quarries which are not in operation.

Ind 69.19 Blasters and explosives. (1) BLASTERS. Persons eligible to be examined to receive a blaster's certificate shall submit, with the proper application form, fees in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Blaster's examination	\$10.00
(b) Blaster's certificate	20.00
(c) Renewal fee for a blaster's certificate	20.00

(2) [INSPECTIONS OF EXPLOSIVES. (a) Use of explosives. Fees for conducting a safety inspection of the use of explosives will be assessed at \$25.00 per inspection. Use of explosives shall include the storage of daily supplies.

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(b) *Permanent storage*. Fees for conducting a safety inspection of a permanent explosive storage facility will be assessed at \$50.00 per inspection.

Note: This inspection fee is intended for blasters and explosive contractors working independently of mine, pit or quarry operations.

Ind 69.20 Certification of uniform dwelling code inspectors and independent inspection agencies. All applicants for certification as a certified inspector or independent inspection agency shall submit, with the application form, fees in accordance with the following:

(1) CERTIFIED INSPECTORS. Persons applying for initial certification or recertification as a certified inspector shall submit fees for each category in which they plan to conduct inspections in accordance with the following schedule:

(b) Educational and training seminars. Fees will be assessed on a per seminar basis for educational and training programs sponsored by the department.

(2) INDEPENDENT INSPECTION AGENCIES. Fees for the initial certification or recertification of independent inspection agencies shall be assessed annually at the cost of \$100.
