- (5) COLLECTION OF FEES. All fees shall be remitted at the time the plans are submitted. No plan examinations, approvals or inspections will be made until the fees are received.

- (b) The department shall allow inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials of all buildings in response to lawful subpoena, or in response to written requests from law enforcement agencies.
- (c) Prior to any inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials, a written, signed application shall be obtained from the person requesting the inspection or copying. The application shall contain a general description of the premises for which inspection or copying is requested and the full name and address of the requester. The written request shall contain a statement that any information obtained from the inspection or copying shall not be used for any unlawful purpose or unfair competitive practice, and that the information set out therein is true and correct. The department will consider the information supplied in the request in conjunction with the type of buildings noted in sub. (7) (a) in determining whether the request for inspection or copying shall be granted. The department shall promptly transmit a copy of this statement to the owner and submittor of the documents being inspected or copied.
- (d) The department may charge a reasonable amount to defray its costs in providing copies.

- (4) DEPARTMENTAL INSPECTIONS. The following fees for on-site inspections shall apply where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code:
- (a) Where employes of the department perform on-site inspections, the fees shall be assessed at \$35.00 for each required inspection or requested inspection.
- (b) The fee for consumer complaint investigations conducted by the department will be charged at the rate of \$15.00/hour plus actual travel expenses.
- (c) Where an independent inspection agency under contract to the department performs inspections, the fees shall defray the actual cost of the service.
- (5) Wisconsin insignia. Fees for Wisconsin insignias for manufactured dwellings shall be assessed as follows:
 - (a) Single-unit dwelling.....\$10.00 per unit
 - (b) Multi-unit dwelling.....\$ 5.00 per unit

Note: Fees for the Wisconsin insignia include monitoring of third-party inspections.

- (6) APPROVAL NUMBERS. A fee of \$200.00 per number shall be assessed where approval numbers are issued by the department for the approval of materials, equipment and devices.
- (7) APPLICATION FOR VARIANCE. The department may grant individual variance to a specific rule upon receipt of a completed application for variance form and a fee in accordance with the following schedule:

Individual Dwelling Owner.....\$ 75.00/petition All others......\$200.00/petition
