- (4) REINSPECTION FEE. A fee of \$27.00 shall be assessed for inspections made by the department to gain compliance with the rules of chs. Ind [ILHR] 41-42, after orders have been issued by the department.
- (5) REGISTRATION FEE. The installing contractor of a new or secondhand boiler or pressure vessel shall register the installation with the department before the equipment is placed in operation. The registration fee shall be \$16.00.
- (6) POWER PIPING REGISTRATION FEE. The installing contractor shall register the power piping installation with the department and pay a fee of \$11.00 before the system is placed in operation.
- (7) ALTERATION AND REPAIR FEES. An owner, manufacturer or contractor reporting alteration or repair to a boiler or pressure vessel, as required by the provisions of ch. Ind [ILHR] 42, shall pay a fee of \$16.00 with each alteration or repair report.

(2) CERTIFICATE OF OPERATION. The department shall issue a certificate of operation upon receipt of a \$16.00 fee for each mechanical refrig-

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eration system and the inspection report indicating the equipment satisfies the minimum operating standards specified in ch. Ind [ILHR] 45.

(3) REGISTRATION FEE. The installing contractor of a mechanical refrigeration system shall register the equipment with the department before the equipment is put in operation. The registration fee shall be \$16.00.
