PI 4.01 Salary schedule. Section 39.20 (7), Wis. Stats. (1) Within prescribed limits.

(2) Proof of professional preparation and qualifying experience shall be certified to state superintendent before August 15 or within ten days of employment.

(3) "Experience in years" is defined as a rural supervising teacher or as a county superintendent of schools.

(4) Rating on the schedule shall be made by the state superintendent by August 15 or within 10 days of receipt of certification if employed after August 15. Advancement on the schedule shall be based upon certification of evidence submitted to the state superintendent.

PI 4.02 Expense. Section 39.20 (2), Wis. Stats. (1) Reasonable meal allowances.

(2) Travel allowance shall be at the rate of 7¢ per mile for the first 2,000 miles per month and 6¢ per mile for each mile over 2,000 miles per month. No mileage to be allowed between home and established office. Speedometer readings to accompany expense vouchers for travel. Actual expense for railroad and bus fare incurred or necessary in line of duty. Tax exemption receipts to accompany expense vouchers for travel by common carrier.

(3) Actual and necessary expenses shall include actual expenses incurred in the regular performance of duty as a supervisor under the direction of the county superintendent, in attending the institutes and conferences called by the state superintendent of schools and in attending special regional conferences for county supervisors under the direction of the state supervisors as authorized by the state superintendent of schools.

PI 4.05 Specialists and additional supervisors. Section 39.20 (1) (c), Wis. Stats., (1) The official responsibility of the state superintendent to approve qualifications of supervising teachers and spe-

cialists pertains only to those individuals hired pursuant or reported pursuant to the effective date of chapter 367. (July 5, 1953)

(2) For the approval of qualifications, specialists and supervising teachers (beyond the statutory number) would be divided into these classifications, each possessing the qualifications listed:

(a) *Special state aid reimbursement fields of education*—the qualifications required would be those required by statute for teaching in the special fields (speech correction, mentally retarded, etc.).

(b) *Subject matter supervisors or specialists*—the qualifications required: Wisconsin certification for teaching in the subject matter field (physical education, music, art, etc.).

(c) *Non-subject matter*—the qualifications required: Wisconsin certification as a teacher plus two years of successful related teaching experience (transportation, etc.).

(d) *Other professional workers*—the qualifications required: such training and/or experience as will qualify them for membership in their own national organization (social workers, etc.) such qualifications to be superseded by certification standards when such standards are approved by the department of public instruction.

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for the mentally handicapped, recreation for the mentally handicapped, art education for the retarded and music education for the retarded.

3. Orthopedic specialization. Twelve semester credits of special work are required of which methods of teaching crippled children and practice teaching of crippled children are required. The remaining credits may be chosen from remedial reading, kinesiology or physical reconstruction, survey of pathology of crippling conditions, technique of teaching the mentally handicapped and survey of speech correction techniques.

4. Speech correction specialization. Twenty-one semester credits are required. Introductory speech correction and/or language development, advanced speech correction, techniques of teaching speech correction, practice teaching speech correction, phonetics, hearing rehabilitation and/or acoustic instrumentation and organs of speech and hearing will be required, and the remaining credits may be chosen from speech for deaf, remedial reading and psychology of speech. Note: Personality adjustment in (6) (b) may be used in lieu of curriculum.

5. Vision specialization. Twelve semester credits are required. Practice teaching visually handicapped children, techniques of teaching school subjects to visually handicapped and Braille reading and writing are required, and the remaining credits may be chosen from arts and crafts, introductory speech correction, speech for the visually handicapped and anatomy of the eye.
