ANIMAL TECHNICIAN CERTIFICATION

**VE 6.01 Certification; application.** (1) Application for an animal technician certificate shall be made on forms prescribed by the board, which shall include proof of graduation from a 4-semester course in animal technology, given at a school approved by the board, or an affidavit as specified in s. 453.06 (3) (a) 2., Stats.

(2) The examination fee, established in s. 440.05 (1), Stats., is payable in advance. Failure to pass the examination shall render the applicant ineligible for examination except upon reapplication accompanied by an additional examination fee.

**VE 6.02 Certificate; fee, renewal, display thereof, change of address.** (1) No renewal of certificate shall be issued except upon payment of the biennial fee.

(2) The certificate and renewal shall be displayed in an area open to the public in the place of practice.

(3) Certified animal technicians shall notify the board of any change in their practice address within 30 days of such change.

**VE 6.03 Disciplinary actions.** When a complaint is filed against a certified animal technician, the procedural rules in ch. RL-2, Wis. Adm. Code shall apply. The board may reprimand the animal technician or deny, suspend, limit or revoke the certificate.

**VE 6.04 Examination for certificate.** The examination shall consist of a written examination and a practical examination. Each of these parts shall constitute 50% of the final grade. A total score of 70% is passing.
