

## Chapter Ind 69

## FEE SCHEDULE

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Ind 69.001 Scope. The fees established in the following sections of this chapter shall be paid to the department of industry, labor and human relations for providing those services authorized in the Wisconsin Statutes.

Note: All checks or money orders are to be made payable to Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations.

Ind 69.01 Fee adjustment. Effective July 1, 1983, and thereafter, the fees specified in this chapter may be adjusted by the same percentage amounts, and on the same effective dates, as changes occur in the pay rate of employees of the state of Wisconsin.

Ind 69.02 Handling, copying and miscellaneous fees. (1) **HANDLING FEES.** The department may charge a \$13.00 handling fee to offset administrative costs.

(2) **PHOTOCOPYING FEES.** A photocopying fee of \$.15/page may be charged.

(3) **PLAN REPRODUCTIONS FEES.** A fee of \$5.00/sheet will be charged for plan reproduction.

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(4) **MICROFILM FEES.** Microfilm prints of approved plans for the years 1967-1972 are available at the cost of reproduction.

(5) **MAILING LISTS.** Mailing lists may be obtained for a fee of \$20 for the first 1,000 names and \$5.00 for each 1,000 names thereafter. This fee shall be doubled, if gummed labels are requested.

(6) **INSPECTION AND COPYING OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.** The department shall allow inspection and copying of all plans, specifications and related materials filed with the department, except as follows:

(a) The department may restrict on a case by case basis, the right of inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials where the possible harm to the public interest outweighs the benefits of inspection or copying. The department will restrict inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials for the following types of buildings:

1. Banks, savings and loans, credit unions, securities dealers and other types or parts of buildings where large sums of money, negotiable securities or valuables are stored in secured areas;

2. Jails and other correctional institutions;

3. Public facilities regularly used for the storage or evaluation of evidence in criminal proceedings;

4. Armories;

5. Public broadcasting facilities;

6. Power generating facilities; and

7. Museums and libraries.

(b) The department shall allow inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials of all buildings in response to lawful subpoena, or in response to written requests from law enforcement agencies.

(c) Prior to any inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials, a written, signed application shall be obtained from the person requesting the inspection or copying. The application shall contain a general description of the premises for which inspection or copying is requested and the full name and address of the requester. The written request shall contain a statement that any information obtained from the inspection or copying shall not be used for any unlawful purpose or unfair competitive practice, and that the information set out therein is true and correct. The department will consider the information supplied in the request in conjunction with the type of buildings noted in par. (a) in determining whether the request for inspection or copying shall be granted. The department shall promptly transmit a copy of this statement to the owner and submitter of the documents being inspected or copied.

(d) The department may charge a reasonable amount to defray its costs in providing copies.

Ind 69.025 Fee refunds. (1) GENERAL. If a request for a permit for which a fee is paid and a processing time is specified is not processed by the department within the time specified, a refund of 50% shall be made to the person who paid for the request for the permit.

(2) DEFINITIONS. The following definitions shall apply in this section:

(a) "Fee" means the amount of money paid for a single permit or request for service, but does not mean the total amount of money which may be submitted with an application covering more than one permit or request for service.

(b) "Permit" includes a license certification of an individual or company, examination of plans, initial certificate of operation, registration of a device, approval of a material, shaft excavation permit, petition for variance, permission to start construction, rental unit certificate of compliance, priority review and petition, and underground tank registration and use permit, but does not include any license specified under s. 145.08 (1), Stats., or inspection services.

Note: The length of processing times for various permits may be found in chs. ILHR 1 - 86 chs. Ind 1 - 69.

(3) PROCESSING TIME. (a) *Starting date.* The permit processing time shall begin on the day after receipt of the request for the permit whether by mail or in person. When the department finds that a permit application has been submitted with inadequate information or fees, the processing time shall begin on the day after receipt of the additional information or fees.

(b) *Ending date.* The ending date that will be used to assess whether the permit was processed within the time period specified shall be the date the department actually made a determination to approve, deny or withhold the permit, and not the date on the correspondence noting the action or the date the permit was mailed out.

(4) DETERMINATION. (a) The starting and ending dates recorded on the computer records or individual file will be presumed by the department to be correct and shall be the dates used to assess whether a refund is to be made.

(b) The initial determination as to whether the permit was processed within the time period specified shall be made by the director of the bureau responsible for issuing the permit.

(c) Determinations subject to dispute shall be forwarded to the administrator for a final determination.

(5) PAYMENT OF REFUND FEES. (a) All refunds made by the department shall be forwarded through the United States mail service.

(b) Refunds shall be mailed to the person who paid for the request for the permit at the address of record indicated on the department's request for service forms.

(c) Refunds shall not be made to individuals requesting a refund in person.

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(d) Refund requests made for a permit application that is submitted with inadequate information or fees shall not constitute a legitimate request for a fee refund.

Note: Refunds will generally be made within 30 calendar days after a determination is made that a refund is in order.

(3) **WISCONSIN SPECIAL VESSEL PLAN EXAMINATION.** Plan examination fees for Wisconsin special vessels shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.03-3.

(4) **REINSPECTION FEE.** A fee of \$27.00 shall be assessed for inspections made by the department to gain compliance with the rules of chs. ILHR 41-42, after orders have been issued by the department.

(5) **ALTERATION AND REPAIR FEES.** An owner, manufacturer or contractor reporting alteration or repair to a boiler or pressure vessel, as required by the provisions of ch. ILHR 42, shall pay a fee of \$16.00 with each alteration or repair report.

(6) **CERTIFICATE OF OPERATION.** The certificate of operation fee shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.03-4.

(7) **FEE FOR FAILURE TO HAVE BOILER OR PRESSURE VESSEL READY FOR INSPECTION.** The owner shall pay a fee equal to 50% of the applicable inspection fee for failure to have the boiler or pressure vessel ready for inspection on the date specified unless the owner notifies the department, in writing, 7 days prior to the specified inspection date.

Ind 69.035 Welder certification fee. (1) **ONE TEST REPORT.** Except as provided in sub. (2), persons desiring to be certified as a structural welder shall submit with each qualification test report form a fee of \$22.00.

(2) **TWO OR MORE TEST REPORTS.** When 2 or more welder qualifications are completed and reported within a period of time not to exceed 15 business days, one fee may be submitted in the amount of \$44.00 for the test reports submitted for an individual welder.

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Ind 69.04 Mechanical refrigeration systems. (1) **INSPECTION FEES.** The inspection fees, based on the aggregate tonnage of the mechanical refrigeration system, shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.04.

Note: For the purpose of assessing the inspection fee, the capacity of a mechanical refrigeration system will be determined in tons. One ton of refrigeration capacity is considered to be the equivalent of abstracting heat at the rate of 12,000 Btu per hour.

(2) **CERTIFICATE OF OPERATION.** The department shall issue a certificate of operation upon receipt of a \$16.00 fee for each mechanical refrigeration system and the inspection report indicating the equipment satisfies the minimum operating standards specified in ch. ILHR 45.

Ind 69.05 Anhydrous ammonia systems. (1) **PLAN EXAMINATION FEE.** The owner or user shall submit a fee of \$54.00 for plan examination of each new anhydrous ammonia handling or storage facility.

(2) **INSPECTION FEE.** A fee of \$54.00 for the external inspection of each new anhydrous ammonia tank and system shall be submitted at the time of plan approval. Anhydrous ammonia systems shall not be put into operation until the inspection has been conducted by the department.

(3) **PERIODIC INSPECTION FEE.** A fee of \$64.00 shall be assessed for the required periodic inspection of storage facilities and nurse tanks.

Ind 69.06 Elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks and ramps, personnel hoists, lifts for the physically disabled and material lifts. (1) **PLAN EXAMINATION AND APPLICATION FEES.** Fees for the examination of plans or application or both submitted in accordance with the requirements of ch. Ind 4, shall be determined at the rate of 1% of the cost to the purchaser, excluding building construction. The minimum fee shall be \$35.00.

(2) **INSPECTION FEES.** Inspection fees for new installations, alterations, periodic inspections, and reinspections shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.06-1.

Note #1: The following is an identification of the various classes used in Table 69.06-1.

- Class 1—Freight elevators (single belt, double belt and cable controlled elevators) sidewalk elevators, sidewalk type elevators and grade level elevators;
- Class 2—Passenger and all other freight elevators not in Class 1;
- Class 2A—Lifting devices used by the physically disabled;
- Class 3—Material lifts;
- Class 4—Personnel hoists;
- Class 5—Hand power elevators;
- Class 6—Dumbwaiters (power);
- Class 7—Escalators, moving walks and moving ramps per unit. A single section having a travel of one floor defines an escalator unit;
- Class 8—Special purpose personnel elevators.

Note #2: Any elevator or dumbwaiter classification may be identified by number of landings. Example: A 6-landing passenger elevator would be classified as class 2-6.

(3) **CERTIFICATE OF OPERATION.** The certificate fee shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.06-2.

**Ind 69.07 Amusement rides. (1) PLAN EXAMINATION, DATA REVIEW, REGISTRATION AND INSPECTIONS.** Fees for amusement rides shall be determined in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) Plan examination for new amusement ride tramways (see s. ILHR 33.01 for definition) ..... \$135.00 per plan submittal
- (b) Review of engineering analysis and test data associated with the acceptance of Class 3 and 4 rides ..... \$135.00 per review
- (c) Annual registration for amusement rides, see s. ILHR 34.04:
  - 1. Coin operated kiddie rides with a maximum capacity of 3 children ..... \$15.00 per ride
  - 2. All other rides ..... \$35.00 per ride
- (d) Inspection of coin operated kiddie rides with a maximum capacity of 3 children ..... \$35.00 per ride
- (e) Inspection of Class 1 amusement rides ..... \$54.00 per ride
- (f) Inspection of Class 2 and 3 amusement rides, except amusement rides that the manufacturer estimates require more than 40 work hours for erection ..... \$116.00 per ride
- (g) Inspection of Class 4 amusement rides and amusement rides that the manufacturer estimates require more than 40 work hours for erection ..... \$169.00 per ride
- (h) Inspection of amusement ride tramways.....\$203.00 per tramway
- (i) Late registration fee (failure to register amusement ride before opening it to the public) ..... \$39.00 per ride
- (j) Reinspection fee for each inspection after the first reinspection to gain compliance with department orders..... \$135.00

Note: For the purpose of determining the correct classification of rides, the following information is provided from s. ILHR 34.03:

CLASS 1: Rides that move passengers in a mild manner.

CLASS 2A and 2B: Standard thrill-type amusement rides.

CLASS 3: Major thrill-type amusement rides.

CLASS 4: Rides which do not meet criteria of the above classes and which require load testing prior to operating.

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(2) **FEE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION.** Registration and inspection fees for amusement rides shall be paid annually before registration is processed by the department.

**Ind 69.08 Certificates of competency and insurance company assessments.** (1) **CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.** Insurance company employes eligible to be examined for competency as a boiler or elevator inspector shall submit with the proper application form, an examination fee of \$70.00.

(a) Boiler inspectors receiving a reciprocal certificate of competency by qualifying as a member of the national board of boiler and pressure vessel inspectors shall submit with their application form a fee of \$54.00.

(b) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination need not submit an additional examination fee when the application for reexamination is filed within 12 months from the date of the previous examination.

(c) The annual renewal fee for certificates of competency is \$27.00.

(2) **INSURANCE COMPANY INSPECTION ASSESSMENTS.** The department may inspect any installation which is also inspected by a certified inspector employed by an insurance company or agency. When the department inspection confirms that the insurance inspection report is incomplete, invalid or unacceptable, the department will assess the insurance company or agency a fee in accordance with s. Ind 69.03 or 69.06 (2).

**Ind 69.09 Buildings, structures, heating and ventilating.** (1) **PLAN EXAMINATION.** Fees for the examination and approval of all plans submitted in accordance with the requirements of chs. ILHR 50 to 64, shall be determined in accordance with the following:

(a) *Building, heating and ventilating.* Fees for the examination of all building and heating and ventilating plans shall be computed on the basis of the total volume of the building and shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.09-1.

Note: See s. ILHR 51.01 (189a) for the definition of the term "Volume".

1. Exceptions. a. Warehouses. The fees for plan examination of warehouses shall be determined in accordance with par. (a) (intro.) except that the fee may be reduced by 30%. The minimum fee shall be \$60.00.

b. Replacement of heating equipment. The fee for the approval of the replacement of a furnace or boiler in an existing heating system with no alterations to the heating system shall be \$27.00.

c. Examination fees for multiple identical buildings at the same site. The fees outlined in this subparagraph may be applied to a project which contains multiple identical buildings. In order to qualify for this fee, the plans for all buildings shall be submitted at the same time and construction of all buildings shall commence within 12 months from the date of approval issued by the department. Approval shall expire for all buildings not started within 12 months of approval. The plans shall be submitted in one of the following ways: building and heating, ventilating and air conditioning; or building; or heating, ventilating and air conditioning. The fees for the examination of building and heating and ventilating plans for the first building shall be computed from the fees set forth in Table 69.09-1 on the basis of the total volume of one building. The fees for the examination of the remaining buildings shall be computed on the basis of \$60.00 for each identical building for building plans and \$60.00 for each identical building for heating and ventilating plans.

(b) *Permission to start construction.* The fee for a permission to start construction shall be \$60.00 per permit.

(c) *Building alterations.* The examination fees for alteration plans of existing buildings and structures undergoing remodeling or review of tenant space layouts shall be computed on the basis of 2¢ per gross square foot of the floor area, roof areas and external wall surfaces undergoing remodeling. The minimum fee shall be \$60.00.

1. The fee specified in par. (c) (intro.) shall be based on the actual gross square footage of the area being remodeled. When the remodeling of an individual building element affects the compliance of the code for the entire area, the examination fee shall be computed on the basis of the total square footage of the affected area.

2. Where the total plan examination fee calculated under par. (c) (intro.) exceeds that determined under par. (a), the examination fee may be determined under the requirements specified in par. (a).

3. Where heating, ventilating and air conditioning alterations are submitted with the building alteration plans, no separate examination fee shall be required for the heating, ventilating and air conditioning plan remodeling.

4. Where heating, ventilating and air conditioning alteration plans are submitted separately from the building alteration plans, the examination fees shall be computed on the basis of \$3.24 per \$1,000 cost of the alteration. The minimum fee shall be \$60.00.

(d) *Revisions.* The fee for revisions to previously examined plans and previously reviewed petitions for variance is \$60.00 per plan or petition. This paragraph applies when plans are revised for reasons other than those that were requested by the department.

(e) *Footing and foundation plans.* The fee for a footing and foundation plan submitted separately is \$90.00 per plan.

(f) *Structural plans.* The fees for the examination and approval of structural plans shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.09-2. Trusses, precast concrete, laminated wood beams, and other structural elements, when submitted separately and not included with general building plans, shall comply with this paragraph.

(g) *Fire escapes.* The fee for fire escapes is \$40.00 per plan.

(h) *Stadia, grandstands and bleachers.* The fee for stadia, grandstands and bleachers is \$19.00 per 1000 seats or fraction of 1000 seats, with a minimum fee of \$40.00.

(i) *Industrial exhaust systems for dusts, fumes, vapors and gases (government owned only).* The fee for industrial exhaust systems for dusts, fumes, vapors and gases is \$40.00 per plan.

(j) *Spray booth plans (government owned only).* The fee for spray booth plans is \$40.00 per plan.

(k) *Miscellaneous plans.* The fee for miscellaneous plans such as canopies, a building's structure for "fast track" construction, and approval requests for structures cited in s. ILHR 50.12 (1) (a) 1., is \$60.00 per plan.

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(2) **MATERIAL APPROVALS.** The fee for approval numbers issued by the department for the approval of materials, equipment and devices, shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.09-3.

(5) **COLLECTION OF FEES.** All fees shall be remitted at the time the plans are submitted. No plan examinations, approvals or inspections will be made until the fees are received.

(6) **PRIORITY PLAN REVIEW.** An appointment may be made with the department to facilitate the examination of plans in less than the normal processing time. The plans shall comply with the provisions of s. ILHR 50.12. The fee for this type of plan examination shall be determined at twice the normal rate, based on the appropriate category of plan specified under this section.

(7) **FEE FOR EXTENSION OF PLAN APPROVAL.** The examination fee for a plan previously approved by the department for which an approval extension is requested shall be \$60.
