



**SENATE AMENDMENT 7,
TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 69**

November 9, 1995 - Offered by Senator JAUCH.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 2, line 6: delete lines 12 to 19, as affected by assembly amendment 3,
3 and substitute:

4 “(b) Nothing in this section prohibits a political subdivision from continuing to
5 enforce an ordinance or resolution that is in effect on the effective date of this
6 paragraph [revisor inserts date], that regulates the sale, purchase, purchase
7 delay, transfer, ownership, use, keeping, possession, bearing, transportation,
8 licensing, permitting, registration or taxation of any firearm or part of a firearm,
9 including ammunition and reloader components, and that is not the same as or
10 similar to a state statute, up until the date of the next spring or general election that
11 is held after the effective date of this paragraph [revisor inserts date], except that,
12 if the existing ordinance or resolution is approved in a referendum that is held in the
13 political subdivision at that next spring or general election, the political subdivision
14 may continue to enforce the ordinance or resolution after the date of the election.
15 The ballot question shall be “Shall the [name of political subdivision] continue to

1 enforce the [ordinance or resolution] which does the following: “[text or summary of
2 the ordinance or resolution]?””

3 (c) Nothing in this section prohibits a political subdivision from enacting and
4 enforcing an ordinance or adopting and enforcing a resolution or, subject to par. (b),
5 amending an ordinance or resolution that is in effect on the effective date of this
6 paragraph [revisor inserts date], after the effective date of this paragraph
7 [revisor inserts date], that regulates the sale, purchase, purchase delay, transfer,
8 ownership, use, keeping, possession, bearing, transportation, licensing, permitting,
9 registration or taxation of any firearm or part of a firearm, including ammunition
10 and reloader components, if the ordinance, resolution or amendment is approved in
11 a referendum that is held in the political subdivision.”.

12 **2.** Page 2, line 21: after “(2)” insert: “, or a county ordinance or resolution that
13 is enacted, adopted or amended under sub. (4) (c)”.

14 **3.** Page 2, line 22: after “(a)” insert “or (b)”.

15 **4.** Page 2, line 23: after “(2)” insert “or (4) (c)”.

16 **5.** Page 3, line 1: after “(a)” insert “or (b)”.
